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Overview:

The vision of HealthCapable is to create a network of health care providers who use a standardized system to convey to the patient, and the next doctor, the essential elements of personal health information that are created, and frequently verified, during a physician visit. The HealthCard™ has proven that it creates value for every participant from the outset. The system is an incremental approach to a complex problem – starting with the creation of a medication list that works from doctor to doctor, eventually incorporating computerized interfaces to encompass all key personal health information elements.

As health information technology evolves, a fundamental problem has emerged – the systems being installed are not designed to work together. Personal health information is expensive to develop, yet sits in silos of information that don't talk to each other, which are therefore of limited value to the average patient who visits multiple physicians who use disparate systems that don't communicate with each other. The HealthCard™ concept, created by HealthCapable, addresses this issue in a way that is useful to patients and physicians across the industry,

regardless of whether they have already installed an electronic medical record system. According to many estimates, at this point, 80% of physicians have not.

HealthCapable is comprised of more than 20 highly qualified medical and technical experts – including many volunteers - who are committed to the concept. Patients and providers who participated in our first clinical trials have enthusiastically endorsed our service and the overall concept. Building on this initial success, we are introducing the concept to the Chicago market – and we expect to use this experience to build a model for the nation.

The HealthCard™ system could save the state of Illinois \$300 million annually for Medicaid patients alone.

Key Features:

- ATM-like card that allows patient to convey personal health information from provider to provider. Easy to use for patients and providers.
- Privacy is protected – Access is limited to providers who are caring for the patient.
- No expensive systems for hospitals, clinics or physicians to purchase. Provider only needs Internet access.
- Participating providers are the source of information. No need for patient to translate personal health information.
- Secure system – security structure same as structure used by major national financial institutions.
- Provides Medication Reconciliation across the Continuum of Care (Medication List Management) – additional savings captured by improved formulary/price awareness.
- System uses real time clinical information rather than claims-based data.
- More than satisfies the Joint Commission on Hospitals Requirements for medication reconciliation that must be implemented this year.

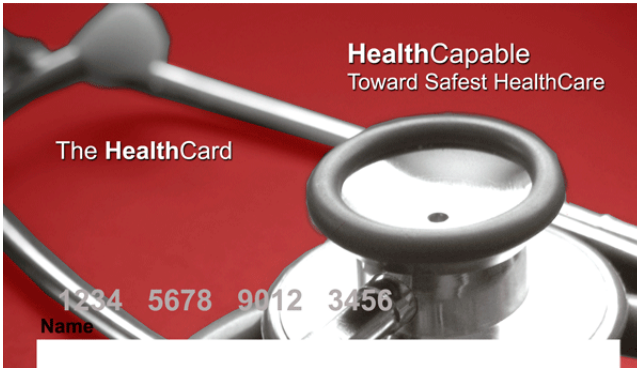

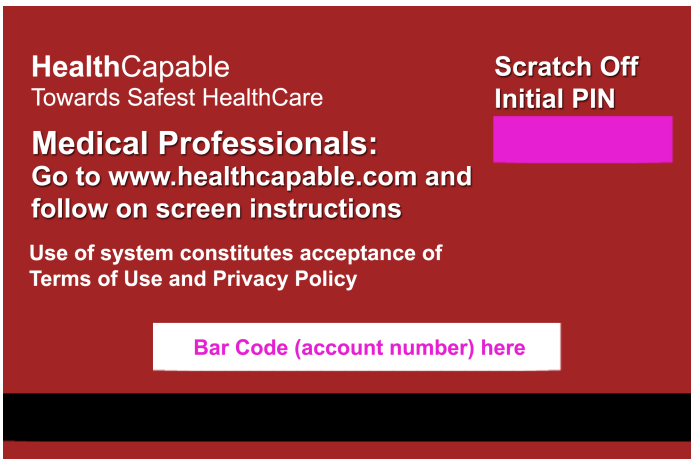
